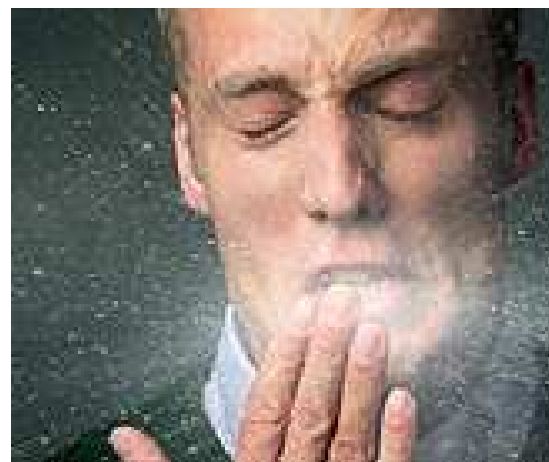
If you are worried about the swine flu vaccination you should talk to your doctor or nurse at the surgery.



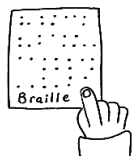
Remember

What is the swine flu vaccination?



The swine flu vaccination will help to stop you getting swine flu.
There is a leaflet which tells you about swine flu.

The swine flu vaccination is sometimes called other names.

It is sometimes called the swine flu jab or the swine flu injection.



The nurse at your doctors surgery will give you your flu vaccination.

The nurse will give you an injection in your arm.

Some people are frightened of injections and needles.

Tell the nurse if you are frightened and she will talk to you and help you.



What is good about the swine flu vaccination?

Having the swine flu vaccination is really important to help you stay healthy and well.



What is not good about the swine flu vaccination?

There are some problems that you can get when you have the swine flu vaccination.

These are called side effects but not everyone gets them.



Some people get a sore arm where they had the injection.

Some people get a headache.



Some people can feel a bit unwell for a few days.
